- Chapin High (SC)** Ryan Cole (lead teacher) 803-606-0567  
Coach Cole has taught this course since 2005. He started with 30 students (2005), then 185 students (2006) and now he and four others teach it to 315 students in the school (2007).
- Lovejoy High (TX)** Mike Goddard (Principal) 469-742-8704  
Ryan Mitchell (Teacher)  
Recently expanded program to teach this curriculum to all freshmen after a successful first year.
- Crest High (NC)** Ginger Hamrick (lead teacher) 704-482-5354  
She has been teaching this curriculum since 2003 to females.
- Goodrich High School (MI)** Dave St. Aubin (Principal) 810-591-2250  
Began using curriculum with all freshmen in 2007. Sharp principal with a great plan.
- Sun Valley High (NC)** Randall Watts (Assistant Principal) 704-296-3020  
Uses this curriculum with their freshmen academy.
- Clarksville High (TN)** Harold Smith (Principal) 931-320-5193  
Used this curriculum at Parkland High (NC) before bringing it to Clarksville High.
